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Admission Policy

1. Background

1.1 Subject to the South African Schools Act and any applicable provincial law, the admission policy of Sun Valley Primary School is determined by the governing body.

2. Legislation

2.1 This admission policy at Sun Valley Primary School must be read in conjunction with:

2.1.1 The SA Schools Act of 1996

2.1.2 The Provincial Gazette Extraordinary No. 5136 of 16 May 1997

2.1.3 The Provincial Gazette Extraordinary No. 5212 of 9 December 1997

2.1.5 The Sun Valley Primary School Constitution

3. Enrolment

3.1 Learners may be enrolled at 5 years turning 6 by 30 June. Preference will be given to learners who turn 7 during their Grade 1 year. The learner's age should not exceed his Grade plus 6 for admission. Sun Valley Primary believes that children turning 7 years are best suited to effective learning in Grade 1.

3.2 The class size should not exceed 32 learners.

3.3 The learner should have completed a Reception year at a recognised Pre-School. The Pre-School Principal must sign the application form.

3.4 The age of the learner should not exceed two years above or below the chronological average age of the Grade.

3.5 The learner should be a resident in Sun Valley area. These include learners that live in the vicinity of Hazelwood Park, Wyngard heights, Milkwood Park, Sunnyside, The Lakes, Dassenberg, San Michele, Silverglades, Fish Hoek (west of Riverside Road), Fish Hoek Mountainside, Noordhoek

and west of Quarry Road.

3.6 Learners with siblings currently at Sun Valley Primary School should enjoy preference.

3.7 Sun Valley Primary reserves the right to interview prospective learners.

3.8 A Teaching and Learning Equipment fee will be charged to guarantee enrolment. The fee will cover most stationery and textbook requirements for the academic year.

3.9 Parents must agree to pay the school fees as per the resolution adopted by a majority of parents attending the Annual General meetings in accordance with the Sun Valley Primary School Constitution. Both parents must indicate their agreement by signing the enrolment form. In the case of divorced/separated parents, it is the responsibility of the parent applying at the school to obtain a signed copy of the enrolment form from their divorced/separated partner.

3.10 The school budgets for Welfare Grants from the income. This Grant is made available by a Welfare Committee after perusing detailed documents completed by the parents. The State does not fund Welfare cases.

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
